CHICKENS, including DUCKS and all POULTRY

No permit is required to raise and keep backyard poultry on a non-commercial basis at a residential property in Doylestown Township, but you must follow the requirements of Township Code Section 175-16 H-11 (d). You can access the Twp. Code from the Doylestown Township website/information/Twp. Code

- 1. The property must be a minimum of 40,000sq ft to be able to keep poultry.
- 2. 5 birds are permitted for the first 40,000sq ft., and one additional bird is permitted for each additional 10,000sq ft. of lot area.
- 3. No rooster is permitted on lots less than 5 acres. <u>NOTE</u>: A rooster is not required for chickens to lay eggs.
- 4. Any chicken coop, hen house, pen or fenced in run is to be a minimum of 50 feet from the rear or side property line. All structures associated with keeping the poultry are to be to the rear of the residence.
- 5. No facility for storing feed or manure shall be closer than 50 feet to any property line.
- 6. The exterior areas of henhouses or chicken coops shall not be illuminated.
- 7. A written waste storage and removal plan shall be submitted to the Township and kept on file.
- 8. Poultry must be kept in a coop, enclosure, or fenced area at all times. Poultry are not permitted to roam freely.
- 9. If you are interested in keeping backyard chickens, we recommend that you contact Delaware Valley University, 700 East Butler Avenue, Doylestown, PA 18901, as they periodically hold Backyard Chicken keeping classes for those wishing to enter this hobby.
